M42 weekend closure toolkit





Introduction

Huge investment in transport infrastructure around East Birmingham and Solihull is underway with HS2 constructing Britain's new high speed railway including the new HS2 Interchange Station.

Located near to the National Exhibition Centre and Birmingham International Airport, the Interchange Station will be a major transport gateway for the region, providing high speed rail connections to London, Birmingham and the North of England.

Highways England will be improving the M42 junction 6 to increase capacity to the NEC and the airport and TfWM is developing a new Sprint bus route along the A45 creating reliable bus connections between Birmingham and Solihull.

With all these improvements happening there will be some disruption to journeys in this area and we are here to help you keep moving.

Transport for West Midlands are working closely with HS2, Highways England and LM to make sure all visitors and businesses are aware of the closure and are supported to keep moving.

What is happening?

To ensure that the local road network is fit for purpose when the future HS2 Interchange Station is operational, HS2's contractor LM is expanding and improving the existing road network and creating new routes on HS2 land. In early August 2020, a key piece of work in this area will be to install a highways bridge spanning the M42. The M42 will be closed between junctions 6 and 7A (northbound) and junctions 7 and 6 (southbound) after evening rush hour on Friday 7 August 2020, and reopen before morning rush hour on Monday 10 August 2020.

Travel advice:

Travelling on the M42

A signed diversion will be in place for motorists travelling northbound from M42 J6 advising motorists to use the A45 / A446 to rejoin at M42 J9 northbound.

Southbound traffic will be signed from the M42 J9 to use the A446/A452/A45 to rejoin the M42 at J6.

If travelling north or south between the M6/M40 consider travelling via the M5.

If you are travelling to Birmingham Airport or the NEC from the M6 you will need to use M6 J4 and follow the diversion route to M42 J6. Allow extra time for all journeys.

Travelling locally

If you travel between Birmingham and Coventry via the A45 or the A452 then look for alternative routes and leave extra time.

Travel around Solihull, Marston Green and the surrounding areas may be busier than normal. Plan ahead using apps and journey planners.

Key messages:

Plan ahead and leave more time for your journey: If you travel on or around the M42 J6 to J7a (northbound) or J6 to J7 (southbound) you may need to allow more time for your journey.

Use public transport wherever possible: This is to reduce congestion in the immediate area. Fewer people are able to travel on Public Transport at the moment. If you are travelling a shorter distance, consider whether you can walk or cycle.

Think about your options: The closure of M42 J6 to J7a (northbound) and J6 to J7 (southbound) will mean that you may need to plan an alternative route. Check the latest traffic conditions before you leave using apps like Google Maps or Waze.

If you work: Speak with your employer about whether there is any flexibility in your hours of work.

And if you are an employer: Consider if there are times your team could avoid travelling altogether, such as working from home for all or part of the weekend closure.


For those using public transport

When using public transport consider the following advice:

- Stay apart and wear a face covering.
- Do not crowd at doorways to get on board and leave space for people to exit.
- Do not sit next to others unless you're travelling with people from your household.
- Use mobile, smartcard or contactless payments.
- Allow extra time in case you can't get on the first service that arrives.
- When you arrive at stops or stations check for any changes to the way to you need to enter or exit. If you have Covid-19 symptoms please do not travel and follow the latest government guidance on self-isolation and shielding.
- If you sneeze or cough please use a tissue and bin this as soon as you can.
- Travel with hand sanitiser where possible in order to protect yourself and others whilst you are travelling.

Travelling locally:

The M42 will be closed between junctions 6 and 7A (northbound) and junctions 7 and 6 (southbound) after evening rush hour on Friday 7 August 2020, and will reopen before morning rush hour on Monday 10 August 2020.

This means that there will be more traffic on local roads and travelling around Solihull, Marston Green and surrounding areas may take longer, so plan ahead and leave extra time.

If you travel between Birmingham and Coventry via the A45 or the A452 consider looking for alternative routes and leave extra time.

M42 temporary closure

The M42 between junctions 6 and 7A (northbound) and junctions 7 and 6 (southbound) will be temporarily closed from Friday 7 August to Monday 10 August 2020

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.



To ensure that the local road network is fit for purpose when the future HS2 Interchange Station is operational, LM is expanding and improving the existing network and creating new routes on HS2 land. Located near to the National Exhibition Centre and Birmingham International Airport, the Interchange Station will be a major transport gateway for the region, providing high speed rail connections to London, Birmingham and the North of England.

To link the new network with existing routes, LM will build four connecting highways bridges. The first of these new bridges will

To install the bridge deck, the M42 between junctions 6 and 7A (northbound) and junctions 7 and 6 (southbound) will be closed after evening rush hour on Friday 7 August, and reopen before morning rush hour on Monday 10 August.

A signed diversion route will be in place for road users. If work progresses faster than expected, the M42 will be reopened earlier
